

28 count evenwea	ONE square on the chart = ONE square on the fabric ave TWO threads= One stitch on the fabric. of the diamond stitches travel over TWO squares or FOUR threads.

Small design No 7	6: 31 x 31 stitches. Material required: 7 x 7 inches 7: 20 x 20 stitches. Material required: 6 x 6 inches 8: 68 x 68 stitches. Material required: 10 x 10 inches
	kein - ONE strand of thread skein - TWO strands of thread
Method: 1. Find the centre	of the fabric and work outwards using ONE strand of thread for the back stitch and TWO strands for the cross stitch.
	and LOOK at the stitches to see which ones are ONE square wide but TWO squares long. (See picture) Build the pattern up step by section in turn until Step 4 is completed.
3. Work round the	central motif adding in the flowers and leaves until the motif is completed.
4. Take four motif	centres and join them together to make a small square block 20 x 20 stitches. Use the design as a gift tag or card insert.
5. The small desig	In No 6: 31 x 31 stitches is a pretty single motif which can be used on its own or joined together to make a more complex pattern(No 8)
6. The large desig (see chart).	n No 8: 68 x 68 stitches is made by joining four of the motifs together and adding a simple border using a variation of the flower design
7. Beads can be a	dded to the centres of the flowers if required. Add the beads after the embroidery has been completed using matching thread.
8. Place the embro	oidery face down on a soft towel and press lightly.
